## Trainer Introduction

**Marc Finaud** is a former French diplomat with vast experience in bilateral and multilateral diplomacy (in human rights, arms control and disarmament) that he has been sharing with students and professionals in international affairs since 2004, at the Geneva Centre for Security Policy (GCSP), with the UN Institute for Disarmament Research (UNIDIR) and the UN Institute for Training and Research (UNITAR), and now as a Consultant.



## 4 Day-Course Description

This Course gives an in-depth introduction to international security, the conflict cycle, and multilateral responses to both ‘hard’ security challenges (conflict, terrorism, arms proliferation, great-power competition, etc.) and global or ‘human’ security challenges (climate change, pandemics, uncontrolled migration, social inequalities, etc.).

## Course Objectives and Learning Outcomes

This Course aims at providing students and professionals in international affairs with the required tools for understanding key concepts and complex realities and allowing them to be better prepared for acting effectively in such environments.

## Learning Outcomes

At the end of the Course, participants will be able to:

- Understand theories and practices related to international relations, international security, and multilateral diplomacy
- Identify the main challenges to international security and the most effective responses to them
- Differentiate the stages of the conflict cycle and appropriate responses to each one (prevention, management, peacekeeping, peacemaking, resolution, peacebuilding)
- Recognize the importance of the media in international security and the need to develop personal communication skills
