On the same time we wish to educate society and communities on importance of sport towards succeeding of sustainable peace which is very important to accept, recognize, listen, respect and appreciate living together with diversity and united in differences.

Additionally within the Football Championship and Campaign we will promote of UN Declaration and Programme of Action on a Culture of Peace (1999) which surround elimination of all forms of discrimination and intolerance, including those based on race, color, sex, language, religion, political or other opinion, national, ethnic or social origin, property, disability, birth or other status.

Throughout its 17 years of service, the United Nations Office on Sport for Development and Peace (UNOSDP) worked to use sport as a tool to generate peace and well-being in the local and international community.

On August 23rd, 2013, the General Assembly of the United Nations adopted by consensus a resolution establishing April 6th as the International Day of Sport for Development and Peace, a day to increase global awareness, appreciate the accomplishments of sport- based development projects around the world and to promote the use of sport and physical activity as a tool for development and peace.

The history of the United Nations' use of sports to assist individuals in devastating situations began before the creation of the UNOSDP. The UNHCR has been using sports as an instrument to improve the lives of those in refugee camps for decades. They have set up programs in Nepal, Pakistan, and over a dozen more countries. The programs contributed to the rise in school attendance rates, especially among girls, and, according to parents and teachers reduce aggression and violence.

The UN adopted Charter of Physical Education and Sport (1978) states that: "The practice of physical education and Sport has the power to change the world; it is a fundamental right for all, a powerful tool to strengthen social ties and promote sustainable development and peace and well as solidarity, and respect.

It explicitly says that every person is entitled to participate in sport, especially women, young people, the elderly and the disabled. Since access to and participation in sport are human rights, the responsibility to ensure these rights are upheld fell upon governments, the United Nations system and others.

Sport has proven to be a cost-effective and flexible tool in promoting peace and development objectives. In the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development sport's role for social progress is further acknowledged: "Sport is also an important enabler of sustainable development. We recognize the growing contribution of sport to the realization of development and peace in its promotion of tolerance and respect and the contributions it makes to the empowerment of women and of young people, individuals and communities as well as to health, education and social inclusion objectives."

Within the project we are planning to select and involve football team from 8 non for profit organisations from around Switzerland working in peace, human rights, religion, environment, community development and health field. Each football team will consists of 11 person means project will surround directly 88 person and indirectly hundreds of people includes guests, fans, employee and member of the involved organisations.
